Silent Auction Guidelines

- Use the bidder number on the back of this program.
- Please complete the bid sheet with your bidder number.
- Items are divided into two bidding sections. Section one will close at 7:30 and section two at 7:50.
- Bid sheets should not be removed from the table.
- Look for volunteers in the auction area if you have any questions.
- Bid sheets will be collected at the end of each bidding period and sent to the check out area to prepare your invoice.
- Silent auction items will also be transported to the check out area.
- You may pay for and pick up your items at the cashier after the bidding period ends and as soon as invoices can be prepared.



Live Auction Guidelines

- The live auction will begin at 8:00 pm and continue until all items are sold.
- The auctioneer may require a minimum bid.
- To make a bid, raise your bidder number high towards the auctioneer.
- The auctioneer will acknowledge the highest bidder. The highest bidder's number and amount will be recorded for check out.

Payment/Check Out

- Payment in full is required on the evening of the auction and may be made by cash, check, MasterCard or Visa.
- All sales are final.
- Please remove your items from the Winter Garden by the end of the evening unless you make other arrangements with the Celebrate Haiti Committee.
- The Celebrate Haiti Committee has made every effort to describe the items and services accurately. Please note any restrictions or limitations. Services must be used during the period specified. Other items are sold *as is*.
- Check out will begin as soon as items can be recorded and invoices prepared.

Tax Talk

- Tickets are not tax-deductible. The entire ticket cost will be used for food, facility rental, etc.
- The tax-deductible amount of any purchase is the difference between the price paid at the auction and the fair market value of the goods and/or services provided. A good faith estimate of the item's fair market value will be clearly listed in the program and on the bid sheet for silent auction items.
- The fair market value of some items such as works of art, autographed sports memorabilia or similarly unique items may be difficult to establish and will require you to consult with your tax advisor.
